

Minutes of the Corner Canyon High School Community Council Meeting held April 11, 2019, in the Administrative Conference Room.

- I. Welcome
Daniela Dulger called the meeting to order at 5:01 pm. She welcomed everyone and established a quorum.
- II. Review and Approval of March 7, 2019, Minutes – Kathy Hilton/Daniela Dulger
Daniela asked the members of the SCC to review the minutes. Corrections were made.

Motion: Connie Atkisson made the motion to accept the minutes as amended. Bruce Eschler seconded the motion.

- III. Counseling Corner – Sandra Steele
Sandra Steele informed the SCC of events in the Student Center.
 - The Student Center has a web site, (<https://ccstudentcenter.weebly.com>), which is kept up to date so parents may refer to the website for answers to questions.
 - Counselors have been distributing the Senior News Letter to seniors in their classes.
 - 50% of the senior class was not on track for graduation at semester break.
 - Seniors wait to take PE until the end of their senior year
 - Many of the seniors take their core classes online or through CVHS. The credits take time to put on their transcripts. Grades should be turned in to the Student Center by May 15, 2019 to ensure credit so students may be cleared to walk at graduation.
 - Many seniors also have NG's which need to be made up before they may receive a grade and credit for their class before they can walk at graduation.
 - All students should try and make-up credits during the summer and not wait until their senior year. The student's counselor may help the student with the many different opportunities there are to help students make-up credits. There is also a list in the Student Center which may help students choose an alternative for make-up credits.

- Jostens will be here at the school in the commons to deliver caps and gowns. Students will not receive their caps and gowns if they have: an NG, school fines, short on credits for graduation, have not taken the senior survey, or have not taken the civics test.
- Juniors should have received their ACT scores. If the student has not received their score, they should contact the student center.

A parent asked about the test taking the place of the SAGE Test. Dr. Eschler explained to the SCC members that the ASPIRE Test is taking the place of the SAGE Test. The ASPIRE Test's purpose is to better prepare a student for the ACT test. The ASPIRE test is also a better indicator of how the student will do on the ACT test. The ASPIRE Test has four sections, math, science, language, and reading much like the ACT Test.

IV. Principal Items – Darrell Jensen

- Mr. Jensen announced CCHS Teacher of the Year, Steve Reed. At the April 23, 2019, Board Meeting the District Teacher of the Year will be announced.
- Mr. Jensen also explained to the SCC members that the Board of Education is reviewing all school fees, and also setting a maximum amount a student may pay during the school year. He explained there were three main reasons for the change:
 1. Transparency
 2. Access to programs for all
 3. Accountability

The extracurricular participation fees have been divided into 4 categories:

Participation
Camp/Clinic
Uniform/Other Clothing
Travel

The maximum fees are set for each extracurricular activity.

Other school fees for fully or partially enrolled students also have a maximum fee: Activity Fee, Book Rental, Online Technology Support, Curricular fees, and CTE/CTEC fees.

Non-waivable Fees are:

Parking
AP Test
Step2 U Fee
Yearbooks
CTEC Certification
IB Test

A discussion was held with the members of the SCC members and many questions were answered.

- PTSA has a student club. The students buy sweaters, much like the SBO sweaters. Is the PTSA Student Club covered under the fee guidelines?
- One of the parents asked why there was a locker fee when she had been told the school could not charge a locker fee?
- Why is there a fee for Field Trips for the Middle Schools but not for the High Schools? Many field trips are taken Biology, Zoology, Marine Biology, Psychology, Law Enforcement, Drama, and AP Geography.
- Are Caps & Gowns for graduation fee waivable, or are they under the non-waivable fees?
- School dances and stomps/stag dances are different. Stomps/stag dances are \$5.00 per person. School dances, Homecoming, Valentines dance, Black & White Formal, Jr. Prom, and Sr. Dinner Dance can have a fee. How is the school going to keep track of the students who pay for stomps/stag dances when the students pay at the door only? The school dance, tickets are sold in the main office and receipts may be put on the student's account and is included in the maximum a student/parents pay for the school year.
- Also, parents were concerned about summer travel (Camp and Clinics) and travel during the school year. Summer travel is generally leadership conferences, fundamental and techniques, how to conferences, and instructional. The cost for the summer travel should not be added in the \$1,250.00 total for travel for a school group.

If any of the members have any further information or suggestions for the district please contact Mr. Jensen before April 30, 2019.

The fee schedule will be discussed again and possibly a vote taken in the May 7, 2019 Board Meeting.

V. Bylaws: Changes and approval – Daniela Dulger

The changes to the SCC Bylaws were discussed by the SCC members. Most of the changes were made to the Utah Code Annotated numbers. The major change which many of the SCC members disagreed with was in Article 111-Standing Rules, no.2-part ii, last line which stated "The SCC will maintain an odd number of total members." A discussion was held.

Motion: Connie Atkisson made the motion to take the portion of the bylaws which state "The SCC will maintain an odd number of total members.", out of the bylaws. Darrell Jensen seconded the motion. (Copy of bylaws are attached.)

Motion: Bruce Eschler made the motion to accept the bylaws as amended. Connie Atkisson seconded the motion.

VI. Brighton Schedule Changes, Parent concern – Daniela Dulger/Darrell Jensen
At a previous meeting Brighton High School had asked for two of our parents be on a committee to study Brighton High School Trimesters and make suggestions on how to improve the trimester schedule during the school year. The parents were Heidi Grimshaw and Vanessa Croshaw. The parents were never contacted and a meeting was never held.

VII. Other Items

- Wayne Dittmore – (CTE), informed the SCC members that the school would be holding the Career Fair/Job Fair on Friday, April 12, 2019. The Career Fair/Job Fair will start with a dual assembly with a motivational speaker, and during an extended lunch, the job fair will be held in the commons area. Many local businesses will be here to inform the students about their business and job opportunities. He also thanked Chris Morgan and Heidi Mathews for all the work they have done to make the Career Fair/Job Fair a success.
- A parent was concerned because the doors are locked after school and the baseball team could not get into the school to retrieve their backpacks. The coaches were still out on the baseball field. The parent was informed that the coaches had to let the players into the building so they could supervise the players and make sure they picked up their items and left the building.
