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- I. Welcome and Establish Quorum – Daniela Dulger  
Daniela thanked all members for their attendance and welcomed the new members of the SCC, Stephanie Fowler and Devin Morgan. Daniela also asked each member to introduce themselves.

V. Counseling Corner

Sandra Steele updated SCC members on what is taking place in the Student Center.

- Counselors have been shifting gears from cleaning up schedules to providing guidance curriculum.
- College and Career Readiness presentations will be conducted in senior English classes next week. Recorded presentations and activities will be published on the “Class of 2021” canvas page for all online and parent-directed students to participate.
- A Canvas course has been created for each graduating class titled “Class of 20-21,” “Class of 21-22,” etc., and shared on every student’s canvas page. This will be used to supplement counseling curriculum for all students, providing full access to online and parent-directed learners. Currently, links to various college and career resources can be accessed through the student’s canvas page. Curriculum activities will be added throughout the year.
- Virtual Higher Ed Day for seniors will be available online beginning September, 14th at [uaraco.org](http://uaraco.org). There will be a general opening session, as well as video presentations by 15 state colleges and technical schools. This will provide our students with the most accurate, up-to-date information directly from college reps. Access will be ongoing.
- The counselors are focused on getting our seniors on the right foot with credit checks, deficiency notices, and college prep prior to application season.

VII. Covid-19 Action Plan – Darrell Jensen

a. Teachers not wearing masks in class

Mr. Jensen asked if the SCC had any questions he could answer for them.

- SCC members were interested in student’s assessments this year after the way school year ended last year. CCHS is the first school to do student assessments this year and Mr. Jensen will communicate with the SCC members when the data is known.
- The SCC members wanted to know how many positive cases the school had, and how many were out quarantined. Mr. Jensen explained he could not give the numbers for the school but could give the number for the district. !0 positive cases of COVID-19, and 60 – 80 student and teachers quarantined on a district level. None of the cases of COVID-19

were from school exposures. We are in better shape than the rumors you are hearing about.

- Teachers, staff and students are wearing masks throughout the school. Very few students are not wearing masks correctly. SBO Officers have been helping students remember to wear masks and to wear the masks correctly. Students are doing much better than expected. District Superintendent Robins walked in the school and visited some of the classrooms with Mr. Jensen and was pleased with what he saw.
- Some of the teachers were uneasy about starting traditional school. The students have been wearing masks and helping to clean their desks before the next class begins. Teachers and students are getting into a routine and teacher's fears have been relieved.
- Parents feel that some of the information they are hearing is incorrect and that information should be checked before it is given to students/parents.
- Parents asked how many students were online and how many students we had attending class.
  - Students 100% online – 94
  - Students ½ online, ½ attending school – 237
  - Students attending CCHS – 2390
- Parents asked when CCHS would be totally a one to one school. We had enough chrome books for our Junior and Senior classes. CCHS will have 800 Chromebooks by November 1<sup>st</sup>. When the Chromebooks arrive CCHS will be a one to one school. Students are encouraged to use the Chromebooks the district has provided because items will be blocked from personal computers/Chromebooks.
- Parent Teacher Conference for September will be held virtually. Details to be announced later.
- Dances and attending assemblies are cancelled at this time. All outside events are at 25% capacity. Masks are to be worn at all times while on school property inside or outside. SBO's are helping in reminding student.
- Parents commented again on how much they enjoyed graduation for the class of 2019-2020. Parents would like to have the same graduation for the year 2020-2021.

#### VIII. Election of SCC Chair, Vice Chair, and Secretary

Daniela opened nominations for SCC Chair for the school year 2020-2021. Daniela nominated Hal Nicholson. There were no other nominations. Nominations were closed.
