VII. School Safety Report and Digital Citizenship Report – Darrell Jensen

a. School Safety – Darrell Jensen

Darrell asked Dave Barrett to give an overview of our Safety Program at school.

Dave informed the SCC members that the school has 4 safety drills a year: 1-fire drill, 1 – shelter in place drill, 1-earthquake drill, and 1 – intruder in place drill. One of the drills have to be held the first 10 days of school, and the earthquake drill is usually held on the "Great American Shake Out". There is also an evacuation map in each classroom which shows how each classroom should evacuate the building. Also, each classroom has a magnet on the door so the magnet can be removed and the door locked quickly and easily.

A parent asked if we had a plan if parents had to pick pick-up their students. If the students had to evacuate the school and be picked up by a parent, the students staging area would be over in the church parking lot. (the church is by the seminary)

Another question was asked, how long does it take to evacuate the building and account for every student. Days said it take just under 4 minutes.

b. Digital Citizenship Report – Darrell Jensen

Maria Jones gave an overview of Digital Citizenship Week, which is October 18 – 23, 2021. Maria showed a 5 minute video that explained Digital Citizenship week and the goal of the district which is to keep out students safe. A handout packet was given to each SCC member which is very specific in regard to what will be taught during Digital Citizenship Week.

Teachers will be asked to take time out of their classes to focus on one topic per content area. Each department was assigned a content area. The department breakdown is below.
