Math Club will be offering the AMC 10 and 12. It will be on Tuesday, November 14th, from 2:30 - 4:00 pm. Interested students that want to participate need to sign up with Ms. Hill in Room S-206.

The AMC 10 and AMC 12 are both 25-question, 75minute, multiple-choice examinations in high school mathematics designed to promote the development and enhancement of problem-solving skills. The AMC 10 is for students in 10th grade and below and covers the high school curriculum up to 10th grade. Ivy Leagues and top US colleges highly recommend this test.
