Registration and fee payment must be completed in person before the first day of class. It is recommended you secure your spot early, classes will fill quickly. Registration forms and payment are to be turned in at the main office of CCHS. Please keep a copy of your receipt.

REQUIREMENTS TO PASS THE CLASS AND RECEIVE A COMPLETION CERTIFICATE

Classroom Sessions: 27 hours of seat time are required to qualify for a Utah Driver License. In order to provide flexibility and to accommodate busy summer schedules, multiple classroom sections will be offered. Classes will be 3 hours each day during the section. Two classroom sessions will be offered each day. One from 6:00- 9:00 am (AM session) and one from 11:00 am- 2:00 pm (PM session). *Students may choose which session (AM or PM) to attend each day, but attendance at one of the daily sessions is mandatory.* Due to the seat time requirements mandated by the State of Utah, students must attend 27 hours of classroom instruction.*** Students who fail to make-up absences will receive a failing grade. **Students must earn a grade of 80% or higher in order to receive credit for the course.**

Section 1: May 31, June 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 10, 11, 12

Section 2: June 13, 17, 18, 20, 21, 24, 25, 26, 27

Section 3: July 8, 9, 10, 11, 15, 16, 17, 18, 22

Section 4: July 29, 30, 31, Aug 1, 2, 5, 6, 7, 8

The four different sections are scheduled in an attempt to accommodate summer schedules. **Ideally, students will be able to attend all nine days of class for one of the available sections.** It is possible, however, to complete the Summer program by attending classes in two different sections. ***Specific content is covered in each class session, so you will need to match up the days you will miss with those same classes (in sequence) of another section. For example, if a student will be missing class on June 2 in Section 1, they would need to attend the fourth day of class in a different section (i.e. June 20, July 11 or July 27). **Students who plan on splitting sections must send Coach Boyer an email indicating the specific dates he/she plans on attending class (Russell.Boyer@canyonsdistrict.org).**

NO REFUNDS: Refunds will not be issued for students who fail to meet the attendance requirements or who do not earn 80% or higher in the course.

Driving Range: Students will complete 6 hours of behind-the-wheel training on the student driving range. Range sessions do not have to be completed by the end of the classroom instruction. Range times will be offered throughout the summer. Students will sign up for 3 two-hour range sessions that fit their schedule. It is important that students keep their commitment to complete range driving on the days and times they sign up for. Don't sign up for a slot unless you are sure you can attend. Priority for range times will be given to students according to the eligibility date on their Learner's Permit. Students may not sign up for "back to back" range sessions.

Road Driving, Observation and Road Test: Students will complete 6 hours of road driving, 3 hours of behind-the-wheel driving and 3 hours of observation. Two additional hours of observation, either during a road session or during a road test, are also required. The road test will be given by the instructor after road drives have been completed. Road driving times will be scheduled by the instructor.

Learner Permits: Learner Permits can be obtained from the Drive License Division at the age of 15. To receive a 50 question test, pay a \$15 fee, pass a health questionnaire, pass a vision test, provide your original birth certificate and Social Security card, and show two forms of ID proving that you reside in Utah (i.e. Property Tax Notice, Utility Bill, etc.) The State of Utah requires that an applicant under the age of 18 hold a Learner Permit for six months prior to receiving their driver license. **It is highly recommended (but not required) that you get your learner permit before the first day of class, but it is required that students have their Learner Permit by the time the class is over. Range, road driving and road test times cannot be scheduled if a student does not have a valid permit.**
