


- 1. Welcome Andrea Lutz, SCC Chair. Motion was made and seconded to start the SCC meeting. Vote was unanimous in favor of beginning the meeting.
- Minutes Jeff Colemere. Meeting Minutes from January 9, 2025 SCC Meeting were reviewed and approved by unanimous vote.
- 3. District Calendar Amy Boettger and Steve Dimond.
 - Steve is the Chair of the Canyons District Calendar Committee. Amy is a member of the Canyons District Calendar Committee. The Utah Board of Education has jurisdiction over all school calendars for all public schools in the State of Utah. The Canyons District Calendar Committee serves an advisory role for the Utah Board of Education. The Committee recommends to the Board when Christmas break should begin and end, as well as all other school dates within the year. Last year the Board sent out surveys on when school should start and when it should end. The A days and B days (whether they should be on set days of the week or not) is also being discussed by the Committee. Different schools are granted authority by the Board to have different schedules. Corner Canyon SCC is the first SCC to question potential changes to the school schedule. In sum, the Committee is visiting the Corner Canyon SCC to answer questions and to obtain information as to how Corner Canyon would like to address scheduling issues. Specifically, a question has been raised as to whether the school semester should end prior to Christmas break instead of after Christmas break as is the situation now. There are 23 of the 41 school districts in the State of Utah who start school 3-4 days before Corner Canyon starts and 21 of those schools, unlike Corner Canyon, also end their semester before Christmas break. Those same schools end before Memorial Day. Discussions were had about the different scheduling possibilities, including Granite High School's calendar and Alpine High School's calendar and how to address teacher compensatory and professional development days. Concerns include making semesters the same length and having an equal number of A days and B days. A request was made to table any SCC determinations until the SCC is able to hear from Corner Canyon teachers regarding their scheduling preferences.

- 4. Reading and Math Assessments Lesli Morris and Misty Jolley.
 - Lesli is the Canyons District HS ELA Specialist. The prior Reading and Math inventory was sunset, which is why the District had to find a new inventory. The District now uses the MAP inventory, which is a bell curve for both achievement levels and growth levels. The inventory also looks to national MAJ norms in determining the benchmarks on the bell curve. Average achievement and growth range is 41% 60%. If an advanced student achieves 80% they would be considered above average in achievement. However, if that student doesn't reflect growth, the next time they test, they will be at 78% achievement. Lesli claims that the MAP inventory helps teachers focus and ensure that all students achieve and grow on the scale. Teachers may be able to share this data with parents at parent/teacher conferences. The following data was provided to the SCC:



Average Achievement: Students are on pace with their peers in achievement.

Above and Well Above Achievement: Students are above their peers in achievement on the content tested.



Below and Well Below Achievement: Students are below their peers in achievement on the content tested.

Average Growth: Students are growing at an average rate, meaning that they are maintaining their current Achievement. They are on pace with their peers. At this rate they would learn 1 year's worth of material in 1 year.

Above and Well Above Growth: Students are growing at an Above Average rate, meaning they are increasing their achievement. They are moving at a faster pace than their peers and closing any gaps they have in their learning or advancing their learning. At this rate, they would learn more that 1 year's worth of material in 1 year.


Below and Well Below Growth: Students are growing at a Below Average rate, meaning they are diminishing in their achievement. They are moving at a slower pace than their peers and their gaps in learning are widening compared to their peers. At this rate, they would learn less than 1 year's worth of material in 1 year.

You can see the growth from Fall, Winter, and Spring Assessment period. This is based on students who are in the 50% growth percentiles.



5. Counseling Corner – Michelle Anderson.

National MAP Norms

Counselors have been working on scheduling the next semester. Charger fair for incoming ninth graders was held and well attended. A virtual assembly was held for current students. After school scheduling labs were held and extremely well attended. All colleges within the State of Utah will be coming next week to Corner Canyon to talk to students about college enrollment. Sophomore CCRs will be conducted in the next few weeks.

6. Brainstorm Planning Next Year TSSP and LAND Trust – Misty Jolley.

Additional data was provided as to students who received F grades in Q2 2024. In Q2 2023 there were 848 total F grades. In Q2 2024 there were only 555 F grades. The data shows that those students who did not attend class 9 school days or more were by far the majority of those who received F grades. The data shows that the new attendance policy is working. Math and English in Q2 were the highest number of F grades. SCC is looking to focus on preventive measures rather than reactive measures. Discussion was had about parental involvement with their students and whether the school has any way to encourage more parental involvement on behalf of students who are not achieving and growing. Discussion was also had about the redemptive measures for students who receive F grades (e.g. Diamond Ridge Packets).

7. School Information – Misty Jolley.
