
Minutes of the Corner Canyon High School Community Council Meeting held March 6, 2025, in the administrative conference room.


- 1. Welcome Andrea Lutz, SCC Chair. Motion was made and seconded to start the SCC meeting. Vote was unanimous in favor of beginning the meeting.
- Minutes Jeff Colemere.
 Meeting Minutes from February 6, 2025 SCC Meeting were reviewed and approved by unanimous vote.
- 3. District Calendar Teacher Feedback Vanessa Fravel. In response to issues raised during a prior SCC visit by Steve Dimond, Chair of the Canyons District Calendar Committee, and Amy Boettger, member of the Canyons District Calendar Committee, and in response to the SCC's request, teacher Vanessa Fravel polled the Corner Canyon High School teachers to determine their opinion on potentially changing the school calendar. Venessa received 93 teacher responses to the following three questions:

Question No. 1:




The results indicate that 51.6% of teachers polled favored keeping the current calendar, which means the last 2-3 weeks of first semester are in January. 45.2% of teachers polled preferred to have the semester end at Winter break. 3.2% of teachers polled did not have a preference.

Question No. 2:



The results indicate that 60.2% of teachers polled favored keeping the school schedule the way it is. 29% of teachers polled preferred to have a set schedule. 10.8% of teachers polled did not have a preference.

Question No. 3:



The results indicate that a majority of teachers (45.2% and 19.4%) preferred to have a Friday to recover from their 50+ hour work week.

This polling information will be forwarded to Steve Dimond, Chair of the Canyons District Calendar Committee. SCC members were encouraged contact their State School Board Representative to voice their opinions regarding the school schedule.

4. High School Scheduling – Dina Kohler. Dina sought volunteers to serve on the District's High School Scheduling Committee. The A-B schedule start times will be considered by this committee. The District sought one SCC member and one teacher to serve on the committee. Vanessa Fravel volunteered to serve as the teacher representative and Timette Wankie volunteered to serve as the SCC representative.

5. Counseling Corner – Michelle Anderson.

Michelle reported that counselors met with sophomores and their parents for CCRs (junior and senior year planning). Online ELA students are also invited to participate in CCRs. Higer Education Day for juniors was completed with great success. A National Merit Celebration was held to honor the ten students who competed and were also chosen as finalists. Parents of those students participated in that celebration. Efforts are being made to make sure all Seniors have the necessary credits to graduate, which efforts will be ongoing until May 15, 2025. Wellness Week is happening and there was a guest speaker who presented today with the school band, which presentation was very well received by the students. Senior newsletter will be produced for the purpose of informing all graduating seniors of the graduation dates and events. ACT will be given next week. Counselors will be going into the freshman classes to do CARE lessons as a follow-up to GRIT lessons in the fall.

- 6. Brainstorm Planning Next Year TSSP and LAND Trust Misty Jolley. The admin team has been working on the TSSP and LAND Trust goals. A subcommittee was formed consisting of Alisa Brough, Jessica Call, Jeff Colemere, Andrea Lutz and Trina Packard to meet on March 20, 2025 at the school to do a deep dive into the TSSP and LAND Trust issues and goals for the 2025-2026 school year.
- 7. School Information Dina Kohler.

Dina reported that the major fan-based sports are completed with their competitions. Girls and boys basketball went to the finals in State competition. The school play will be performed at the school this week. Orchestra went on tour to see and learn from four major city orchestras. The Drill Team went on a tour to Florida for learning opportunities. The Dance Team and Cheer Team went to California to learn skills from professionals. Nominations for Corner Canyon High School teacher of the year are being considered and will be announced soon.
